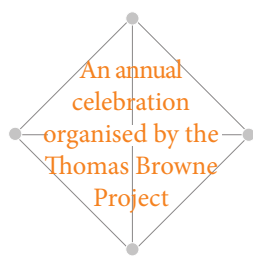




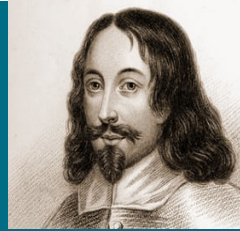

What do you know about... Sir Thomas Browne?

Sir Thomas Browne was a 17th century physician and polymath who lived in Norwich for most of his adult life, in the Hay Hill area of the city. He died aged 77 on his birthday in 1682, on 19 October which is now Sir Thomas Browne Day.

There is a statue of him on Hay Hill and also a set of sculptures that relate to his life and work.

He lived where Pret a Manger is now and he is buried in St Peter Mancroft Church alongside his wife and other members of his family, where there is a collection of artefacts, including a replica of his skull.

He wrote books and essays, conducted experiments, invented words and was generally curious about everything he found around him.

In spite of being well-known and respected in his day and also across the world, he is relatively unknown in Norfolk today.

Sir Thomas Browne Day is an opportunity to learn about this brilliant and fascinating man who was so influential throughout England and Europe in his own day and remains relevant and inspirational in the 21st century.
